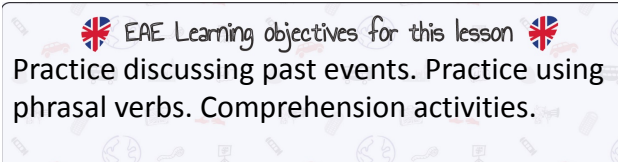


# Travelling through history



## **Activity 1 - Discussion activity**
